Notes on using these tables:

Chlamydia tests reported to the NCSP are based on young people aged between 15 and 24 years and includes tests where sex is male, female, and unknown/unspecified. NCSP returns as of 27.07.09 and laboratory returns as of 30.07.09. These data may not reflect all screens/tests performed. Data includes tests where sex is male, female, and unknown/unspecified.

Data include all tests - screening tests, diagnostic tests and contacts and are presented by LA of residence or "attributed" LA of residence.

Data are number of tests and not number of people tested. Please note that number of tests as collected through the NCSP programme will be used as a proxy for the number of people tested.

Data presented are based on tests with confirmed positive and negative results only. Tests with equivocal, inhibitory and insufficient results have been excluded as most people with these results are retested.

Please note that as of 1st April 2008 partners/contacts reported to the NCSP via the quarterly disaggregate dataset will count towards the Vital Signs indicator target. Be aware partners/contacts reported via the six monthly aggregate dataset will not count towards these figures.

Some tests allocated to PCTs in England may not be attributable to LAs in England.
