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#### Chlamydia Vital Signs denominator data 2009/10:

Population data for 2010/11 are derived from the 2006-based ONS population projections for 2010.

#### Notes on using these tables:

Chlamydia tests reported to the NCSP are based on young people aged between 15 and 24 years and includes tests where sex is male, female, and unknown/unspecified. Data is as of 17/05/2011 and includes tests where sex is male, female, and unknown/unspecified. These data may not reflect all screens/tests performed.

Data include all tests - screening tests, diagnostic tests and contacts and are presented by PCT of residence or "attributed" PCT of residence. "Attributed" PCT of residence is assigned for the NCSP return once data are received nationally. Postcode of clinic is used to assign PCT of residence if a patient has not provided a valid postcode of residence.

Data are number of tests and not number of people tested. Please note that number of tests will be used as a proxy for the number of people tested.

Data presented are based on tests with confirmed positive and negative results only. Tests with equivocal, inhibitory and insufficient results have been excluded as most people with these results are retested.

**Please note that as of 1<sup>st</sup> April 2008 partners/contacts reported to the NCSP via the quarterly disaggregate dataset will count towards the Vital Signs indicator target.** Be aware partners/contacts reported via the six monthly aggregate dataset will not count towards these figures.
